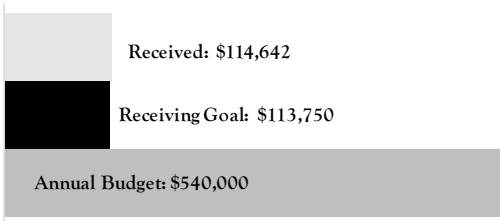
Let's Connect!

The Washington Concert Winds are a select wind ensemble (band) fashioned after the Eastman Wind Ensemble founded by Frederick Fennell in 1952. The purpose of the smaller wind ensemble was to establish a new medium, consisting mainly of one instrument per part, and it was this model that the Washington Concert Winds followed. The Concert Winds have successfully toured the United States and the world attracting students from as far away as Australia. Many of the group's members receive a yearly scholarship for performing in the group. Typical performances will include a bi-annual international concert tour and performances in various churches (like today) and concert halls. The Washington Concert Winds are looking forward to embark on their Spring Tour this coming March to the beautiful island of Puerto Rico.
