
Let's Connect!

Music Notes

On this weekend, we mark the beginning of the Reformation, a date generally established as October 31, 1517 when Luther sent his Ninety-Five Theses to the Archbishop of Mainz. We are a part of that reformed tradition begun 501 years ago. Alongside the significant theological changes brought to the church, the Reformation also had a significant impact on music. Perhaps the most important of those changes was the flowering of hymn singing. The hymn "Ein feste burg" was written by Luther sometime around 1528. The choir will sing its original, rhythmic form while we will all sing the form familiar in most hymnals. The choral and organ music dates from the years following the Reformation, when the church services often featured a sacred cantata based on the scripture text of the day. The organ music is also from this time period.
