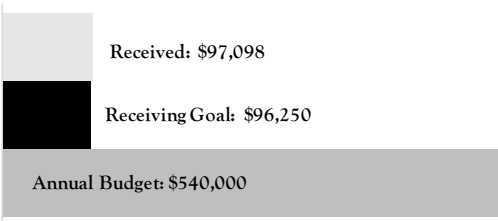
Let's Connect!

Just 46 measures long, it is nevertheless a miniature masterpiece. The text is a poignant reminder of the sacrifice of Christ which we observe through the ceremony of communion today:

Hail, true body,
Born of the virgin Mary;
Who has truly suffered, slaughtered
On the Cross for humanity.
Whose side was pierced,
Pouring out water and blood.
Be a foretaste for us
During our ordeal of death.
