## Music Notes

The pianist this morning is Daniel Wasse. He moved to this area five months ago from Seattle, Washington, to join his wife Helen Tilahun. They live in Baltimore, Maryland. Daniel holds a Bachelor of Music degree from Oberlin Conservatory of Music. He performs and has taught classical piano for the past 20 years. He and his wife Helen feel blessed to get to know the Spencerville Church. For our prelude and postlude, Daniel plays Études (studies) for piano by the great polish virtuoso and composer Frédéric Chopin (1810-1849). While serving the role of technical exercises, Chopin transcends this form to create miniature musical masterpieces.

Spencerville members Juliana Baioni and Regina Andrade Martin play the Music Meditation for the first service, titled “Adoration” by Felix Borowski.

The choral anthem is an arrangement of an African American Spiritual “Steal Away.” This particular spiritual is one that is now understood to have both the overt spiritual theme as well as an underlying coded message of encouragement for those seeking to “steal away” to the Underground Railroad and freedom. The vocal soloist is Amanda Fink, an accomplished mezzo-soprano with opera and oratorio engagements throughout the U.S.
