# **Worship Notes**

Our speaker this morning for both services is Ty Gibson, co-director of Light Bearers ministry and pastor of Storyline Adventist Church in Eugene, Oregon. #### **Music Notes**

We welcome a brass quintet composed of Nate Clark and Kris Westrich, trumpet; Joel Wealer, horn; David Sisk, trombone; Ben Malmer, tuba, to our second worship service this morning.

You will also note that we are using the organ for both Sabbath worship services for the first time since January. This follows several weeks of testing to ensure that the sections of the organ that were disconnected were truly the ones responsible for the interruptions to our services. To most listeners, the organ will sound as it always has, and it might be tempting to think its problems have been fixed. However, none of the repairs for which we still need to raise funds have actually been made. We have only

disconnected parts of the organ and if the past is indication, the problems will spread to other parts of the instrument and may render it more handicapped or totally unusable. A silent instrument is a clearer indicator that it is need of repair, but because we have found these temporary quarantines for the instrument, we will resume using the organ in our services to support our singing and lead our worship. We hope you will continue to give to the project that includes much needed repairs and updates to our platform and to the audio system in our church, both to improve intelligibility of the spoken word and the quality of our video recording and broadcasts.
