About the Music

"How lovely is They dwelling-place" is the fourth, and most well-known movement from Johannes Brahms' German Requiem, so named for having been written in German, rather than Latin. Brahms compiled the text for this Requiem himself, taking the text from the German Luther Bible instead of the standardized Latin text of the traditional Requiem Mass. The movement sung this morning describes the "lovely dwellings" of the Lord and gives a picture of heaven that is to come.
