#### **About the Music**

Today's music touches on themes of childhood, both relating to young people, and as a metaphor for those of any age considered to be the children of God. The offertory is a movement from a piano sonata for four hands written by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart when he was nine years old and on a lengthy and successful tour of Europe. It shares a catalog number with his fourth symphony, written around the same time. It's astonishing that a nine-year-old was composing his fourth symphony (he would eventually compose over 50 symphonies), but more so considering the high level of craftsmanship these early compositions exhibit. Though he was talented, he also worked with purpose and dedication to his craft, an inspiring example of what can be accomplished, no matter the age.

The anthem is a setting of a text by Caroline Sandell (1832-1903), sometimes referred to as the "Fanny Crosby of Sweden." The daughter of a Lutheran pastor, she turned to hymn writing partly as an outlet for the grief she felt at having witnessed the tragic death of her father from drowning. The musical setting was composed by James Bingham, former chair of the music department at Washington Adventist University. Dr. Bingham also previously served as the choral director at Spencerville.
