Music Notes

The German chorale "Wer nur den lieben Gott" (If you will trust in God to guide you) makes three appearances in our service today, as one of our hymns and as the prelude and postlude to the service.

In 1639, in the midst of the Thirty Years War, Georg Neumark was traveling across Germany to school when he was robbed of everything he owned. He would spend the next two years struggling to survive, searching for work in the war torn countryside. When he finally found employment tutoring for a judge in Kiel, he wrote "... this good fortune, which came so suddenly and, as it were,

from heaven, so rejoiced my heart that I wrote my hymn 'Wer nur...' to the glory of my God on that first day."

Its message of faith, trust and hope in God, as well as its stout, singable melody made this hymn a popular selection for worship services in Germany and led to many settings, for organ and for choir by composers from the Baroque to our time. In the best of these settings, the composers use musical techniques to illustrate the joy of following God's guidance. The prelude and postlude give two examples of these techniques, setting this tune with playful, jubilant motives and rhythms.
