Today we welcome the Bertus family as new members to our Spencerville congregation. Lewis is a physician's assistant. Carmay is a medical billing coder. They have two daughters, Abigail and Zayenne. They chose Spencerville as their church home for the diversity, the good school, the good Sabbath Schools, and because it is a Christ-centered church.

About the Music

Our vocal soloist for the second service this morning is Amanda Fink, a rising star in the opera and oratorio world with engagements throughout the country, including solo appearances with Pensacola Opera, Choral Arts Society of Washington, Cleveland Opera Theater and Choral Arts Societ of Washington.

The offertory this morning is an arrangement of the American Spiritual "Give Me Jesus" by arranger Moses Hogan. As with most of the spirituals, the names of the author or composer of the tune and text are not known. The first versions of this song appear shortly after the Civil War. The simple melody and direct text, always with the refrain "Give me Jesus" have a direct and clear appeal. This tune and text are also found in our hymnals, as number 305.

The anthem is an excerpt from the Oratorio "St. Paul" by German composer Felix Mendelssohn. This oratorio was popular and often performed during his lifetime but through the years it failed to retain that popularity and is now rarely performed in its entirety. The libretto (text) was written by the composer in collaboration with his childhood friend, pastor Julius Schubring. They drew their texts from the New Testament, mostly from the book of Acts. The finished work was premiered in 1836 with the English version coming a few months later and the first performance in the United States in Boston a year later. The text, fitting for the theme of todays service is:

Recit

And they all persecuted Paul on his way; but the Lord stood with him, and strengthened him, that by him the word might be fully known, and that all the Gentiles might hear. Aria

Be thou faithful unto Truth, and God shall give to thee a crown of life. Be not afraid, thy help is nigh.
