Music Notes

Today's worship theme reminds us of the Gospel message promised throughout Scripture. With the Easter season approaching, we are reminded of the death and resurrection of Christ, thus promising us everlasting life.

The music text this morning reflects two messages of hope. The offertory is a promise coming from God to man, and a prayer returned from man towards heaven. Craig Courtney's, "Peace I Give to You" quotes John 14:27, saying: "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid."

The anthem, "Cantique de Jean Racine," is composed by Gabriel Faure. It was dedicated to Cesar Franck, whom is represented in the postlude today. The text comes from French poet, Jean Racine, who writes (translated to English):

...O Christ, look kindly on your faithful people

Assembled now to glorify you.

Receive the songs that we offer to your immortal glory

And let us depart, crowned with your gifts.
