Welcome

We want to welcome our youth to both services this morning. You will not only hear them as they present the music this morning, but you will also see them providing service. Several will be worship participants and others will serve as communion participants in the distribution of the elements.

Music Notes

The Spencerville Adventist Academy (SAA) Chorale and Orchestra bring themes of cleansing water as well as heavenly and earthly places to today's Communion Youth Sabbath. The prelude title "Cedar Hollow" is an actual site in the Ozark Mountains. There is a perpetual spring from which flows a small stream or "branch," that supplies ample water for wildlife in the area. This particular work portrays the scenic simplicity and peace of the hollow, accompanied by the sounds of dripping water.

Following the water theme, the Honors Chorus will perform a piece by Palestrina set to Psalm 42:1, "As a deer longs for running water, so longs my soul for Thee, Lord." This will be complemented by a hymn arrangement of the beloved hymn ,"Come Thou Fount" by conductor, Robert A. Martinez.

The hymn's first stanza "streams of mercy, never ceasing," cascades as descending scales in the winds, finally ending the arrangement in a sustained chord, musical painting of the hymn's final line, "Seal it for Thy courts above." The anthem and benediction, in honor of Black History Month, speak of heavenly places beyond our world of sin and pain. The close of the service is a beautiful composition by composer Alan Lee Silva that is a portrait of life growing up in the pastoral foothills of Northern California. "Colors of Home" conveys a warm Americana feeling, featuring beautifully nuanced melodic themes and carefully crafted harmonies.
