MUSIC NOTES

This Sabbath, we welcome back the Washington Concert Winds from Washington Adventist University, directed by Michael Patterson, professor at WAU and Minister of Music at Spencerville Church. The Washington Concert Winds will bless our worship service this morning in preparation for their evening concert at 7:00 p.m. in the sanctuary.

The musical selection is entitled, Before the Sun, composed by living American composer Julie Giroux. The piece is intended to be a depiction of the scene and emotions just before a sunrise takes place, both in nature and in the human mind. The piano solo in the middle represents the silence of night which takes place just before a radiant dawn. This is a beautiful musical and artistic depiction of the silence on earth for the three days Jesus lay in the tomb before His radiant resurrection, a theme we honor today with the communion service.

The postlude, entitled Chorale and Alleluia was composed by Howard Hanson who sat as director of the Eastman school of music for over forty years. This piece, though not containing any lyrics, presents two different themes. The first is a lamenting chorale and the second a joyful exclamation. One can imagine the text implied in the first section—perhaps Kyrie Eleison, "Lord have mercy on us". In the second, one can almost hear the text of Psalm 66, "Let all the Earth cry out in joy! Alleluiah!" We pray this music is a blessing as we worship together.
