MUSIC NOTES

This week we welcome back Javier Gonzalez to Spencerville Church. Javier is no stranger to our congregation, as he is a graduate of Columbia Union College and spent many years performing as a part of a group called Bella Voce. Javier now works on faculty at La Sierra University in the department of music.

He will sing three songs for us today. One of those, *Via Dolorosa*, is heard quite often around Easter time. The direct translation of the title means "the way of pain", which is the name of the path Jesus walked through Jerusalem to Calvary. The song was written in 1984 by Christian music producer Billy Sprague and Christian songwriter Niles A Borop. The text of the song reads as follows:
