MUSIC NOTES

We often translate the word “psalm” as “a sacred song or hymn.” Digging a little further into the original meaning of the word, we find the Greek word “psalmos,” meaning “song sung to a harp.” Greek and Hebrew scholars find even earlier roots of the word’s meaning as “to pluck [a string].” Traditionally, the psalms are ascribed to King David, who played an instrument referred to in the Hebrew Bible as a “kinnor.” While sometimes translated as “harp,” it was actually a lyre (a member of the zither family). The best scholarship we have indicates that the lyre used in Biblical times had four to eight gut strings and was usually played with a plectrum, similar to the nylon pick used by a modern guitarist. King Saul, being the king, would have had access to any instrumentalist in his kingdom, yet he chose David, from which we can infer that David was an extraordinary musician, whose playing could soothe and calm even the soul of a troubled king. In 1 Samuel 16:23, we read “David took an harp [lyre] and played with his hand.” Could David have developed his own playing style that dispensed with the plectrum, using his fingers to directly pluck the strings, much like the technique used by a modern classical guitarist? If so, he would be among the greatest musicians through history who transcended the limitations of their instruments and created new sounds and techniques.

We can imagine what the music played by David on his lyre sounded like, but of course we’ll never know for sure. What we can know is that the music of plucked strings was spiritually moving to our Biblical ancestors, just as it can be today. This morning, we welcome Brazilian classical guitarist Felipe Garibaldi to the platform, as he plays musical selections throughout our worship service, giving us a contemporary taste of the music of plucked strings and a glimpse into the ancient sound world of Biblical music.
