Today, you will notice not one but two concert grand pianos on the platform. The Spencerville Church Steinway grand piano has returned after a comprehensive 10-month reconditioning process. Our beloved Steinway had many significant issues with the action and inner workings of the instrument, the piano was sent to a shop in Pennsylvania where it was disassembled, cleaned, fixed, refinished, and reassembled with many new parts. It's returned just in time for the holiday season!

Spencerville Church wishes to extend our deepest gratitude to the John family for loaning us their Bösendorfer piano for almost a year. It's been used in countless worship services, memorial services, rehearsals, concerts, recordings, and miscellaneous church functions and has served as a beautiful loaner. We are grateful!

Music for worship today features pieces written for two pianos. We welcome back Dr. Mark Di Pinto together with Michael Patterson. They will play the music of Sergei Rachmaninoff and J.S. Bach. You may recognize Bach's BWV 1043 as a Double Concerto for two violins. It is common for much of Bach's music to be played on various instruments, even though the piece initially may have been intended for a different instrument. Today Mark and Michael, accompanied by Mark Willey, will play this double violin concert on two grand pianos instead. Mark Willey will play the string accompanient on the organ.
