MUSIC NOTES

Denique Isaac is our vocal soloist this morning. A native of Baltimore, Maryland, Denique attended Washington Adventist University, and then Indiana University for her Masters degree. She has been engaged in a variety of roles on the stage and oratorio.

The anthem "O, divine Redeemer!" is one of the great standards of the sacred song repertoire. Written in 1872, Gounod's skills as a musical dramatist are on full display. The original French text is by Pauline Viardot. It expresses the profound essence of redemption and devotion, traits which are beautifully amplified by Gounod's musical setting. We hear and can relate to the spiritual journey of the music, from the pleading, introspective introduction, through expressive and passionate dynamic contrasts.

Another great standard of hymnody is the opening hymn "O God Our Help in Ages Past," set to the tune "St Anne." It is a hymn that stands as a timeless testament to the enduring power of faith. Written by Isaac Watts in the early 18th century, the hymn's robust and solemn melody composed by William Croft adds gravity to the profound lyrics, both contemplative and majestic. The text and tune invite us to find solace and strength in the steadfastness of God, echoing through the ages as a source of hope and reassurance.
