MUSIC NOTES

The Adventist Children's Choir (ACC) began in 2009 when they sang "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing," written by Robert Robinson, as a prayer that the Holy Spirit flood our hearts with His streams of mercy. Historians have noted that Ellen White often sang this hymn while delivering produce from her garden to her neighbors by horse and buggy. As we listen to the piano accompaniment played by Sam Miranda, one can almost imagine the bouncy ride. "Hashivenu" is a melodic and hauntingly beautiful Hebrew canonic song based on Lamentations 5:21, "Cause us to return to You, and we shall return and renew our days of old." The younger singers of our choir have enjoyed discovering harmony through the art of singing a canon. "Softly and Tenderly" was written by a well-known and wealthy songwriter of the late 1800s who felt that the rural areas and small towns had little opportunity to hear good music. So he loaded his upright piano on his two-horse wagon and drove into the country to sing and play his hymns throughout the Midwest churches. One of the primary goals of the ACC is to teach today's young people the importance of hymnody and hymn singing. We pray the music blesses you as the children draw our eyes upward in worship.
