Nalli Subrahmanyam Krupakara Rao, born on December 8, 1937, in Bhimavaram, India, was an embodiment of resilience, dedication, and an unyielding love for family. He was the third son of Pastor Nalli Subrahmanyam and Alice Pothuraju, and his life is a testament to faith and the enduring human spirit.

Krupaker began his early learning in Narsapur, India, where he headed off to boarding school at just 9 years old, making friendships that lasted a lifetime. He later attended Spicer College in Pune, India, where he majored in Business Administration and, more importantly, met the love of his life, Evangeline Susheela Giddalore. What started as a courtship deepened and led to marriage, marking the start of their new family life.

With a 1-yr-old son and a daughter on the way, Krupaker displayed remarkable courage by immigrating to the United States, driven by the desire to provide a better future for his family. He worked tirelessly, taking on various jobs, from custodial work to restaurant service, all to reunite his family on American soil. His relentless dedication paid off, leading to a successful career as an Accountant, where he served at the Indian Embassy and ascended to the role of a well-respected and highly valued Comptroller at the luxury brand Taj Hotels International.

Krupaker was known for his gentle disposition, generous heart, playful attitude, devotion to family, and a curiosity to explore. He traveled the world with his family, embarking on global adventures and enjoying tranquil beach vacations. He was a die-hard Washington Redskins fan from the get-go, relishing every second of the football season. Krupaker's green thumb transformed his garden into a community treasure where he generously shared the fruits of his labor with friends. He was an amazing cook, known for whipping up favorite Indian dishes, as well as his famous carrot cake and renown tomato pickle, and even experimented with new creations he found on YouTube to delight his family.

After he lost his beloved wife, Evangeline in June 2009, he deeply grieved for a long time as they were rarely one without the other. The two were seen as a single unit and he couldn't bear to envision a life without her. While no one could ever replace his beloved wife, his heart found solace and joy in the love he shared with his growing number of grandkids. He lived for all of them to see their accomplishments and share his encouragement and adoration.

In his later years, he remained the epitome of activity, walking and running 8-12 miles daily, and motivating others to stay active. He stayed active and full of life up to his last day.
