Be_: Resolutions that Matter for Others

BE A SINGER - ONE VOICE WORSHIP

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God.

— Colossians 3:16

BIG IDEA

Congregational singing is not filler—it is formation. God uses our shared songs to teach truth, unify the church, stir gratitude, and keep us faithful in worship.

MESSAGE SCRIPTURES

Psalm 95
Colossians 3:16
Ephesians 5:19–20
Romans 15:5–6
Exodus 17:7

THOUGHTS

- Singing teaches doctrine with melody (Col. 3:16).
- Singing strengthens and encourages one another (Eph. 5:19).
- Singing unifies a diverse church into “one voice” (Rom. 15:5–6).
- Singing trains gratitude and thanksgiving (Eph. 5:20).
- Psalm 95 calls us to worship with joy, reverence, and surrendered hearts.

QUESTIONS

- Do I treat congregational singing like warm-up—or like worship?
- What truth do I need to sing until it sinks deep?
- How can my voice encourage someone near me today?
- Is there any area where I’m hardening my heart (Psalm 95; cf. Exodus 17:7)?

THIS WEEK: 1 prayer ◆ 1 word ◆ 1 act

Pray: “Jesus, put Your song in my heart—teach me truth as I sing, and make my voice an encouragement to Your church.”

Speak: I will read aloud Psalm 95 to remind myself to sing!

Act: Sing—fully and intentionally—through every song next Sabbath.
